AUDIOLOGY

An AHSA Audiologist will evaluate hearing loss and related disorders, including balance (vestibular) disorders and tinnitus (ringing in the ears). Treatment will include rehabilitative strategy or the provision of an assistive device for individuals with hearing loss. Government assistance is currently available for approved eligible patients.

PSYCHOLOGY

AHSA offers a comprehensive range of psychological services supporting individuals, through various life transitions and challenges.

Areas of treatment include:

DIETITIAN

Dietitians apply the art and science of human nutrition to help people understand the relationship between food and health. They assist with making dietary choices enabling clients to attain and maintain health, aiming to prevent and treat illness and disease.

Areas of treatment include:

- Malnutrition screening and management
- Diabetes
- Cardiovascular conditions
- FIT/Bowel conditions
- Enteral feeding (NG & PEG)
- Renal disease/dialysis
- Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)
- Osteoporosis
- Cancer/Oncology
- Parkinson's Disease

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

An AHSA Occupational Therapist will assist by ensuring the patient is able to access their environment effectively despite whichever injury, disability, illness or disease they may be enduring.

Areas of assistance include:

- Acquired brain injury
- Medical aid assessment
- Equipment prescription
- Falls prevention
- OH&S consultation
- Seating and wheelchair prescription

DIABETES EDUCATOR

A qualified Diabetes Educator will provide a comprehensive and individualised program to ensure patients are well informed regarding what is the optimal management of their Diabetes.

Careful monitoring will occur along side a continued education process, ensuring minimal negative comorbidities arise as a result of poorly maintained blood glucose levels.

REMEDIAL THERAPY

AHSA Remedial Therapists can provide relief of aches and pains by providing relaxing remedial massage or even a more intensive and focused muscle tone relieving treatment.

Whether it be muscle spasm, strain or soft tissue injury, a Remedial Therapist will provide professional and evidence based treatments.

SPEECH PATHOLOGY

An AHSA Speech Pathologist will assist individuals in the assessment, diagnosis and evidence based treatment of all swallowing and communication disorders.

Areas of treatment include:

- Swallowing difficulties/ dysphagia: any problem with drinking, chewing, eating, controlling saliva, taking medications
- Auditing of texture modified food and thickened fluids
- Staff education and training in texture modification, thickening of fluids and feeding skills
- Speech difficulties/dysarthria or dyspraxia; slurring of speech or mixing up of speech sounds
- Language difficulties/ dysphasia: understanding conversation and formulating words into sentences
- Voice difficulties/dysphonia: weakness in voice, poor vocal volume, hoarse voice.

PODIATRY

Podiatry interventions are designed to diagnose, treat and educate the patient in the **following areas:**

- Routine and regular foot/nail care
- Fungal infections of nails
- Wart and verrucae treatment
- Foot orthotics and arch supports
- Ingrown toenails
- Diabetes foot care
- Treatment and maintenance assessment
- Biomechanical gait
- Heel, arch and forefoot pain
